Stocker's Lake Bird Report 2017

The year started with a dozen **Red-Crested Pochard**, but no partridge in a pear tree, up to 140 **Wigeon** and a redhead **Smew**. Wildfowl counts were relatively high. The spring held 28 **Little Egrets** at roost, **warblers** arriving in April, **Cuckoos** in May and a breeding **Goldeneye** on adjacent Springwell Lake.

June, July and August provided a variety of **warblers** and sightings of up to 3 red eared terrapins. Large numbers of **black headed gulls** and **common terns** suffered from predators, amongst them **coot**s. August highlights were a **Sparrowhawk** breeding nearby and Muntjac on the reserve.

In September there was no early passage of migrants until on 21st when a mixed **hirundine** flock obliged. A **stonechat** and **kestrel** were at Stocker's farm. October saw increased numbers of **greylag** and **cormorant**, flocking **long-tailed tits** and 4 **cetti's warbler**s along the river with **redwing** and 30 **red-crested pochard** on adjacent Bury Lake.

November was still relatively mild with working parties at the lake in full swing. A **Peregrine** flew over and the BBC Country File team was on the reserve. Small numbers of **Siskin** arrived with the odd redpoll. **Goldeneye** numbers were increasing (immature males) by mid-month along with an appearance of a **Great White Egret**, probably the long-staying Maple Lodge individual. At month's end **Chiffchaff** were calling along the Colne, Red crested pochard were up to 32 on Bury Lake, there was a single **Goosander** on Springwell and **Siskins** were increasing.

December started cold and was then mild with rain and gales. By mid-month a few **fieldfare** and **redwing** were around, **goldeneye** were increasing up to 8, along with a few **Water Rail.**

A full species by species report for the year follows below.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE - Good numbers bred nearly all year - up to 13 birds in winter juveniles present till December. 25 birds in November. LITTLE GREBE - 2 pairs seen in March was the maximum count CORMORANT - up to 25 wintering birds; have bred; seen eating Pike and Tench.

LITTLE EGRET - highest count up to 28 birds roosting; good numbers of breeding birds

GREAT WHITE EGRET - one sighting of (probably) the Maple Lodge individual in November

GREY HERON - Heronry consisted of least 30 birds

MUTE SWAN - breeding pairs wintering in greater numbers on Bury Lake. 1 pair

had 5 cygnets in May GREYLAG GEESE - 25 birds seen on 14th September, 40 on 30th January. CANADA GEESE - a common breeder in good numbers EGYPTIAN GOOSE - a maximum of 9 birds of this increasing Goose. BARNACLE GOOSE - one record - probable escape WIGEON - highest count 140 MALLARD - wildfowl counts, i.e. 11 and 12, seem low for this common species. GADWALL - 31 was the highest count of this common duck species SHOVELER - this common dabbler feeds explosively in circles - 68 and 53 in Oct and Nov COMMON TEAL - always low numbers of this species MANDARIN - 1 bird Seen in April RED-CRESTED POCHARD - averaging a dozen on Stocker's; however 32 were present on adjacent Bury GP. POCHARD - breeding in June; 1 female with 2 juvs; 8 wildfowl count TUFTED DUCK - highest count of 74 birds in the Winter GOLDENEYE - highest count up to 17 individuals. A female with 7 young once again on Springwell Lake SMEW - 1 Redhead seen in January RED KITE - 5 birds seen in January SPARROWHAWK - a regular species. Bred in Alder woodland on Bury Lake and seen hunting regularly. BUZZARD - 2 birds seen in Feb plus other singles OSPREY - 1 sighting in May KESTREL - a few records of this common species HOBBY - 4 Sightings in the summer. PEREGRINE - 2 Sightings in January and 1 in November when 'BBC Country File' was present. MERLIN - a female seen from the kingfisher hide. WATER RAIL - up to 3 birds seen over the winter MOORHEN - 8 birds a maximum. Under recorded COOT - 135 in October; numbers down on previous years. OYSTERCATCHER - 2 Max; Spring thru Summer LAPWING - up to at least 30 birds in the early winter COMMON SANDPIPER - 3 Records for this year **GREEN SANDPIPER - 1 sighting in July** COMMON SNIPE - 1 record JACK SNIPE - 1 February record GREAT SKUA - 21st August by DB Hale BLACKHEADED GULL - highest count 70 approx. breeding regular on rafts designed for terns COMMON GULL - highest count of 13 HERRING GULL - highest count of 6 LESSER BLACK BACKED GULL Up to 8 birds maximum

GREATER BLACK BACKED GULL Highest count of 17 YELLOW LEGGED GULL 1 on 12th January COMMON TERN Common breeder on rafts provided heavily predated this year and displaced by black headed gulls. **BLACK TERN 1 on 9th May** WOODPIGEON - Common resident CUCKOO - 2 Birds recorded in May **RING-NECKED PARAKEETS - Increasing population 13 max** LITTLE OWL - One individual on Stockers farm SWIFT - Highest count of 40 in June KINGFISHER - Highest daily count of 3; mostly along the Colne. GREEN WOODPECKER - More heard than seen; opposite canal in Garrets Wood. GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER - Commonest woodpecker seen regularly LESSER SPOTTED WOODPECKER 1 in March, 2 in April SAND MARTIN - A rare hirundine; 3 in July, 20 in September SWALLOW - 1st on 30th March; up to a dozen bred at Stockers farm HOUSE MARTIN - 50 in September MEADOW PIPIT - Small flock of around 12 at the farm. **PIED WAGTAIL - under recorded** GREY WAGTAIL - few records mostly near canal WREN - common breeding species **DUNNOCK - common resident ROBIN** - common resident STONECHAT - one at Stockers farm WHINCHAT - August and September records at the farm BLACKBIRD - common breeder FIELDFARE - lower numbers this year; a few along the Colne in Hawthorns REDWING - more numbers; above 60 in February SONG THRUSH - under recorded; a few records only CETTI'S WARBLER - a maximum of 5 singing individuals SEDGE WARBLER - 6 singing birds max. **REED WARBLER - common summer resident** GARDEN WARBLER - 5 Singing birds in May LESSER WHITETHROAT - one April record WHITETHROAT - a few records in May BLACKCAP - a maximum of 8 birds in the summer WILLOW WARBLER - up to 3 birds calling NIGHTINGALE - 1 bird heard in May CHIFFCHAFF - wintering along the Colne seen in December. Highest count was 6 in March GOLDCREST - seen flocking with tits in Winter SPOTTED FLYCATCHER - a single record BLUE TIT - a common passerine seen at feeders

GREAT TIT - a common passerine LONG TAILED TIT - seen in family parties in winter and summer. NUTHATCH - breeding pairs calling and on feeders TREECREEPER - a pair seen in March STARLING - decreasing resident although seen roosting over Springwell reed bed JAY - a number of birds seen in the Alder woodland MAGPIE - a common breeding resident RAVEN - a few sightings this year CARRION CROW - a common resident HOUSE SPARROW - always at Stockers House **CHAFFINCH** - seen in Alders in Winter SISKIN - big flocks of up to 80 in Winter GOLDFINCH - flocking with Siskins; a common species BULLFINCH - numbers improving recently; 3 birds in March (2 males and 1 female). **GREENFINCH** - 1 record in March LESSER REDPOLL - 1 Sighting in Alders with Goldfinch LINNET - Small flock at Stockers Farm REED BUNTING - Breeding bird; singing males in Spring **BLACK SWAN - Escapee**
